New era begins for Victory Riders Calgary

VRC will head into the 2025 Riding Season with a new President at the helm. At the Club's Annual General Meeting on February 23, John B stepped up from the Vice President's position to take the big chair.

Also at the AGM, **Randy H** stepped up to take the **Treasurer** position, replacing **James H** (no relation) who retired after an amazing **17 years** as Treasurer of VRC and its predecessor, the Victory Riders Association.

Drifter Don moves to the **Past President** position, joining four others who carry that title: **Gary W, Ron DeG, Roy B and Kelly C.**

The AGM part of the February meeting was slickly handled by the Nomination Committee - KD and Marilyn C. They did an excellent job of both handling the nominations and dividing up the Club's designated activities.

Joan G was added to the Social Media team, And Joan and Doug I. took on the task of storing the club paraphernalia including the pop-up tent and display materials (as soon as

they can find room.)

Drifter will retain some of his past activities such as this **newsletter** and the **Facebook** page and **web site** - **www.VictoryRidersCalgary.com**. He is looking for help with those ongoing projects.

The Nomination Committee also introduced a novel idea to deal with the vacant Ride Captain position. It suggested the idea of Ride Leaders (referred to as Ride Wranglers.) These would be Members who come forward on an individual-ride basis to lead rides.

"This is a good idea," **Drifter Don** said at the meeting. "It allows a rider to step up and lead a ride to the level of his or her confidence. It could be an aftermeeting ride to **Bragg Creek** for coffee, a **Highway 40 loop** or a major ride. The **Wranglers** can get a feel for and get practice in leading a group without taking on the full role of Ride Captain."

As the final action at the AGM, the Club voted **unanimously** to name retiring treasurer **James H** as its first **Life Member**. See the full story below.

One set of Executive patches remains unclaimed

There is one more set of patches to be picked up.

At our **February AGM**, the position of **Vice President** did not get filled. If you think you have what it takes to **step up** when the President is away and to **advise** the Executive, talk to **President John B** or any **Executive** member.









Gas pains?

Is higher **octane** better? With gas costing an arm, and a leg, can we run lower-octane, **cheaper gas**? Or is higher better?

Octane rating is not a direct indication of fuel's overall **quality**. It's the measure of a fuel's ability to resist 'knocking' or 'pinging' during combustion, caused by the air/fuel mixture detonating prematurely in the engine.

The little black book that came with your **Victory** says, "...use only unleaded gasoline with a **91 pump octane** minimum...." Typically, regular gas is 87 octane, mid-grade is 89, and premium is 91, but 93 and 94 octane are available at extra cost.

Can a Victory run regular gas?
Some riders say they always have with no ill effects. Others say they tried it once and the motor felt like it was coming apart. A lot **depends** on how you ride. If it's hot and you're heavy on the throttle like **Mark A**, 87 octane won't cut it. If you need to save a few bucks, try it. Go to a higher-octane fuel if it knocks or pings. Unsure? Run what Victory recommends.

Does going **higher** than 91 octane improve performance? That's like the start of an **oil thread**. Some say there is better throttle response. **YMMV**. You will never harm an engine by running a higher-octane grade than you need to, but you could harm your **wallet**.

And if there's no mid or premium available when the needle is on E? Experienced riders carry **octane booster**, but a fill up of 87 won't be terminal if you go easy on the throttle, keep the bike cool and keep the revs low.

Victor Daly...

VRC loses valued member

It is with considerable sadness that we learned one of our members, Victor Daly, won't be joining us this riding season.

Victor lost his battle with cancer on **March 3**. We will remember him for his dedicated support of the Club. Vic would ride his **Victory Vision** or drive down from **Red Deer** for our meetings and events. He rarely missed a meeting.

He will also be remembered for his great sense of humour. When the Club initiated the **10k+ Club** for people clocking more than 10,000 kms a year, Vic proudly entered that he had racked up a total of **400 kms**. That honesty led to the creation of the low-miler Skunk Trophy of which he was the first recipient.

He took the joke in stride and came back the next year having completed both the **Four Corners** and the **Three Flags** rides, recording more than **26,000 kilometres** in the process.

When he was asked to return the **Skunk Trophy** (a plush skunk toy) he said, "Nope." His granddaughter had fallen in love with the skunk and there was no way he was taking it away from her. The Club had to go



out and buy another one.

Victor is survived by his wife **Nellie**, son James (Susan), stepsons Brad and Brian Himer, six grandchildren, two greatgrandchildren, and numerous nieces and nephews.

He will be missed. Our thoughts go out to Nellie and the rest of his family.

At his request, there won't be any services.

Biker Down offering safety courses

Biker Down, an international motorcycle safety organization, is offering free courses in Calgary.

In conjunction with the Canadian Red Cross, Biker Down is offering the courses on March 22, April 12 and April 26.

Full details are available on the group's **website** www.bikerdown.ca.

The free three-hour course is broken down into three segments: Incident Scene Management which includes managing an accident site; First Aid for Motorcyclists which includes safe

helmet removal; and **The Thinking Biker**, a module that covers the science of why we are not seen on the road and more. You can earn your **Biker Down Canadian Red Cross First Aid Certificate** upon completion. It is valid for three years.

Several **Club Members** have signed up for the course.
